With less than 2% of Canada's undeveloped hydro potential, we could power ALL of Canada's light duty vehicle fleet and still have energy to spare!

Only about 20% of our total energy-**20%** Use is currently electric. There is certainly room to do better and electrify our economy further.

GENERAL GROWTH



There are **YEARS** worth of electricity supply stored in our reservoirs across the country.



Waterpower comes in many shapes and forms. While greenfield projects were common over the past decades, we will likely see more refurbishments over the next few years.
